

Johns Creek high school & The Teen Driver Safety Foundation are bringing back the nationally acclaimed New Driver Car Control Clinic® to our school. The clinics are scheduled for October 20th and October 22nd or 23rd and February 3rd and February 4th or 5th Johns Creek High School. The Clinic is a hands-on, behind-the-wheel program that teaches new drivers and their parents what to do when something goes terribly wrong in the traffic stream. According to the National Safety Council, one in four teens will be involved in a crash during their first year driving. And the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety reports that 85% of crashes involving a 16-year-old are driver error. "We simply must do more to train our children how to handle emergency situations." Each parent-student team (the Clinic does not accept a teen without a parent) attends a Thursday evening classroom session from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. and a four-hour behind-the-wheel session on either Saturday or Sunday using the family or teen's own car. The cost is \$179 per team and includes a 56-page workbook and 45-minute DVD, plus a certificate of completion for submission to an insurance company for a possible discount.
